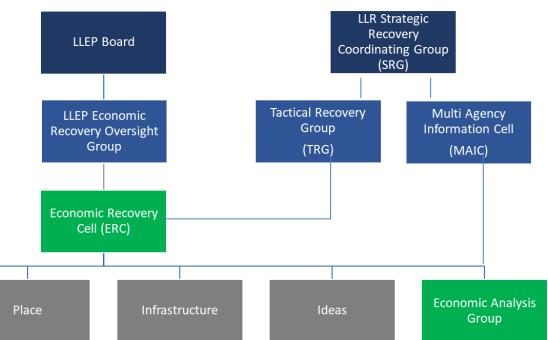

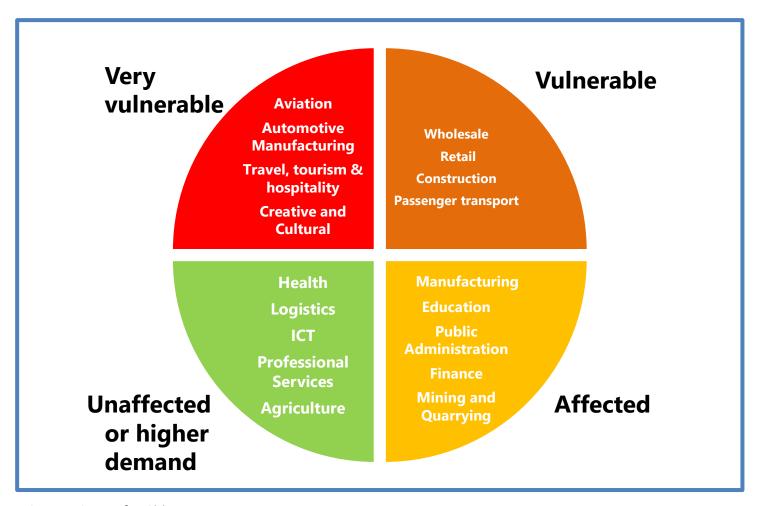

#### **Economic Uncertainty**

- Projections and scenarios for 2020 economic outturn vary from a contraction of -4.9% (IMF) to -14.0% (Bank of England, 7<sup>th</sup> May)
- OECD report 10<sup>th</sup> June predicts -11.5% contraction in GDP
- Quarterly figures for UK GDP released on 12 June showed that the UK economy had fallen by a record 20.4%.
- Business Impact of Coronavirus Survey shows that 26% of East Midlands businesses reported their turnover had decreased by more than 50%, compared to 25% of businesses in the UK
- 82% of East Midlands businesses have continued to trade through lockdown





## Sector Risk Index



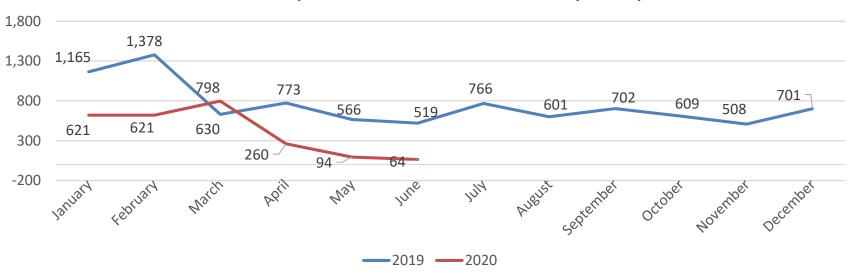


- Claimant count increased by 131.5% or 19,900 people from March to May.
- At 31 May 24.5% of total employment in LLEP area were furloughed (129,700 people)
- 91% of eligible businesses in Leicester and Leicestershire have received Small Business and Retail Grant Funds (to 16/06/2020).
- Job postings have decreased by 34% (EMSI: May '19 vs May '20)
  - Most occupations impacted except health, care and some agriculture
  - Biggest % drop elementary occupations and transport operatives
  - Biggest total drop administrative occupations

#### Dissolved or Liquidated Businesses Monthly Comparator

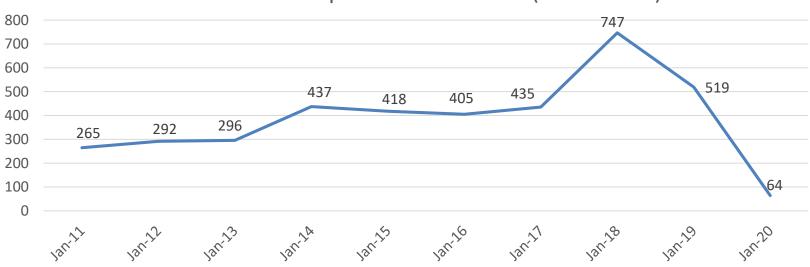

Correlation with overall numbers furloughed is not exact due to rounding and differences resulting from applying national percentages locally. Results in an overall calculation of estimated total numbers furloughed of 133,785 vs. HMRC total furloughed for Leicester and Leicestershire of 129,700. Furloughed employments relate to residency of individual and not site of business premises so this should be interpreted as an indication only, actual figures may differ.
