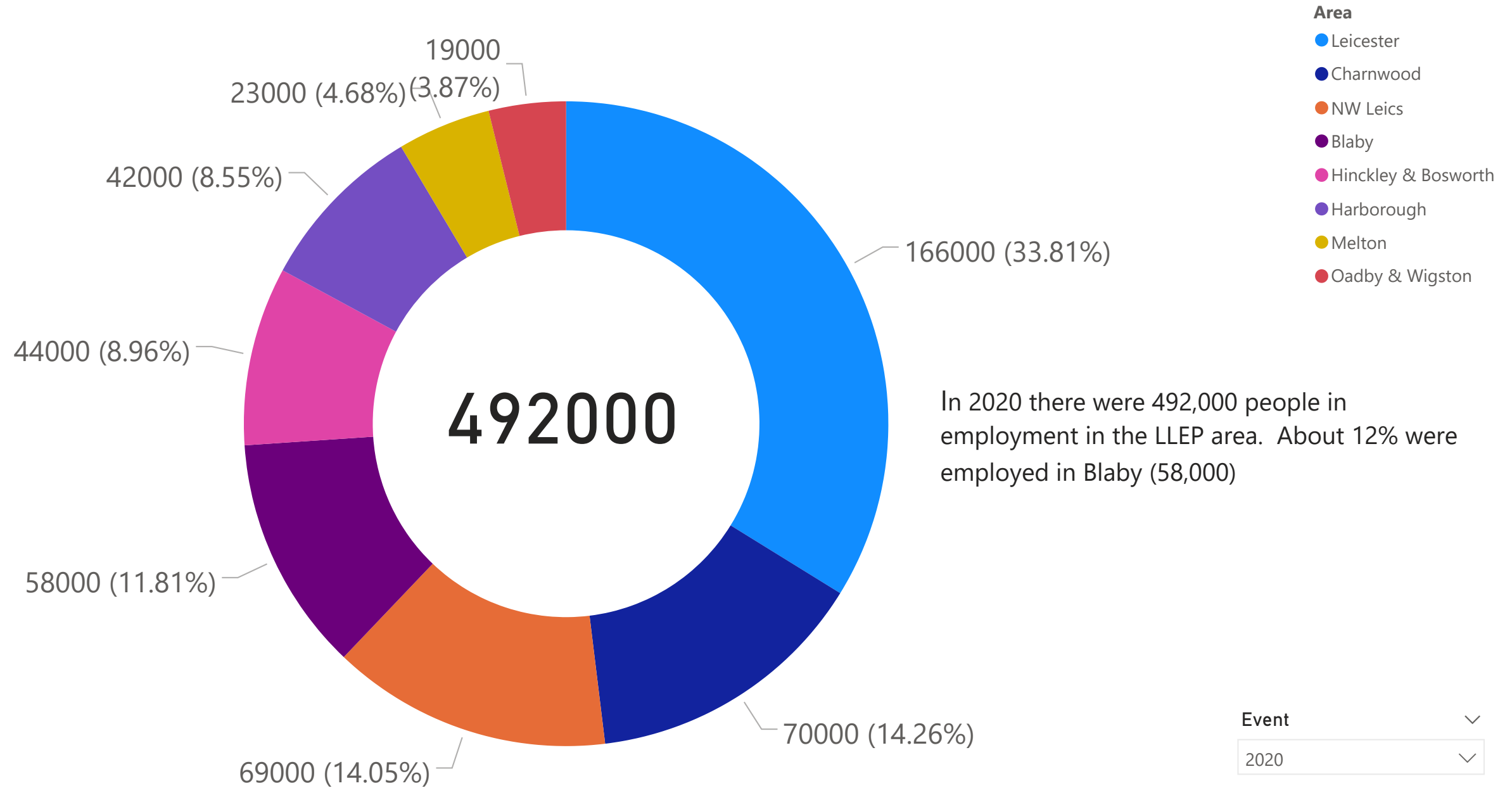
## Initial Breakdown - Blaby

The Business Register and Employment Survey (BRES) provides employee and employment estimates at detailed geographical and industrial levels and is regarded as the definitive source of official government employee statistics by industry. The latest data released in November 2021 relates to 2020 and provides an insight into the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic on industry and related employment. Data is at a 2 digit level (Standard Industrial Code).

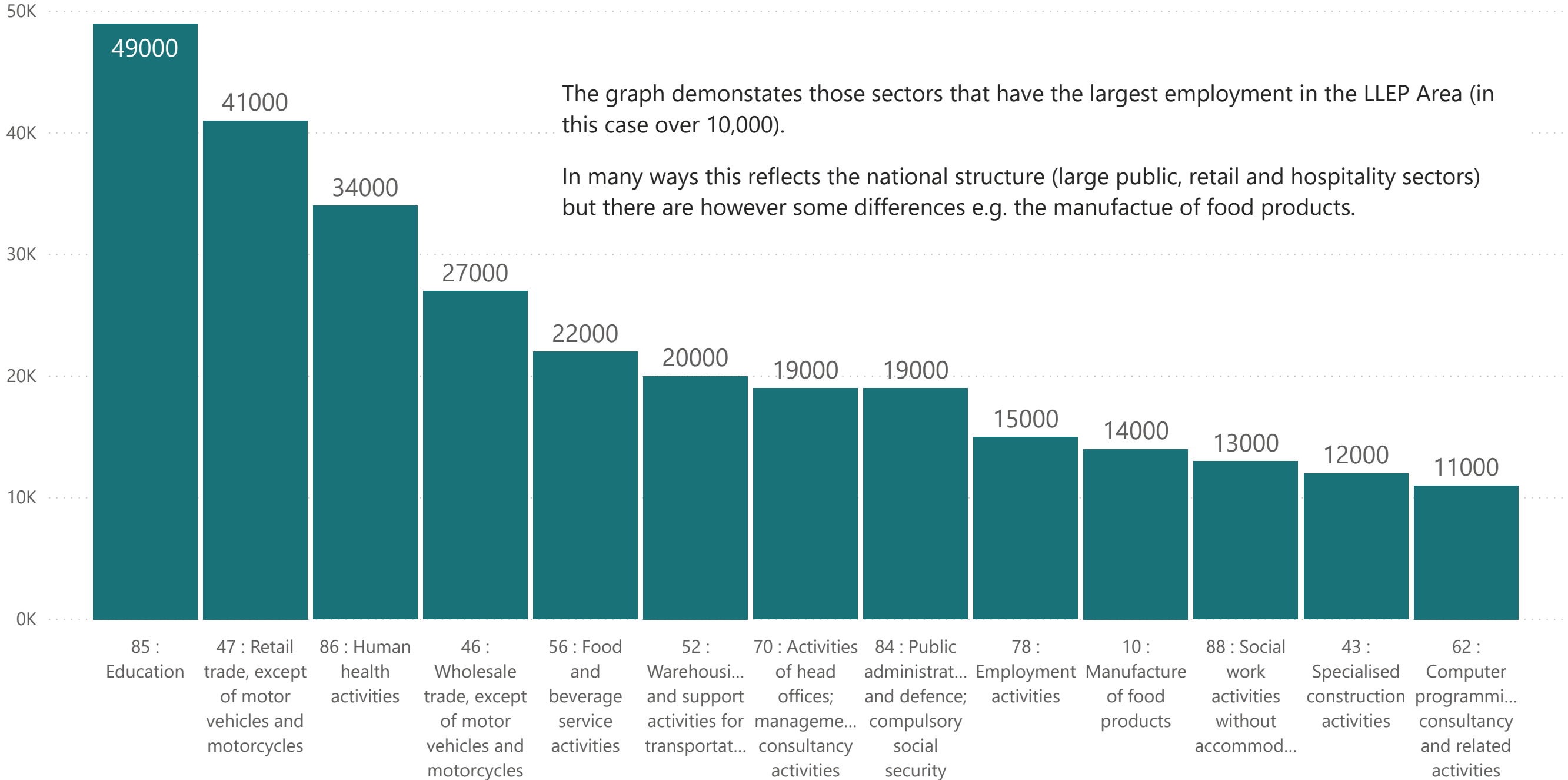

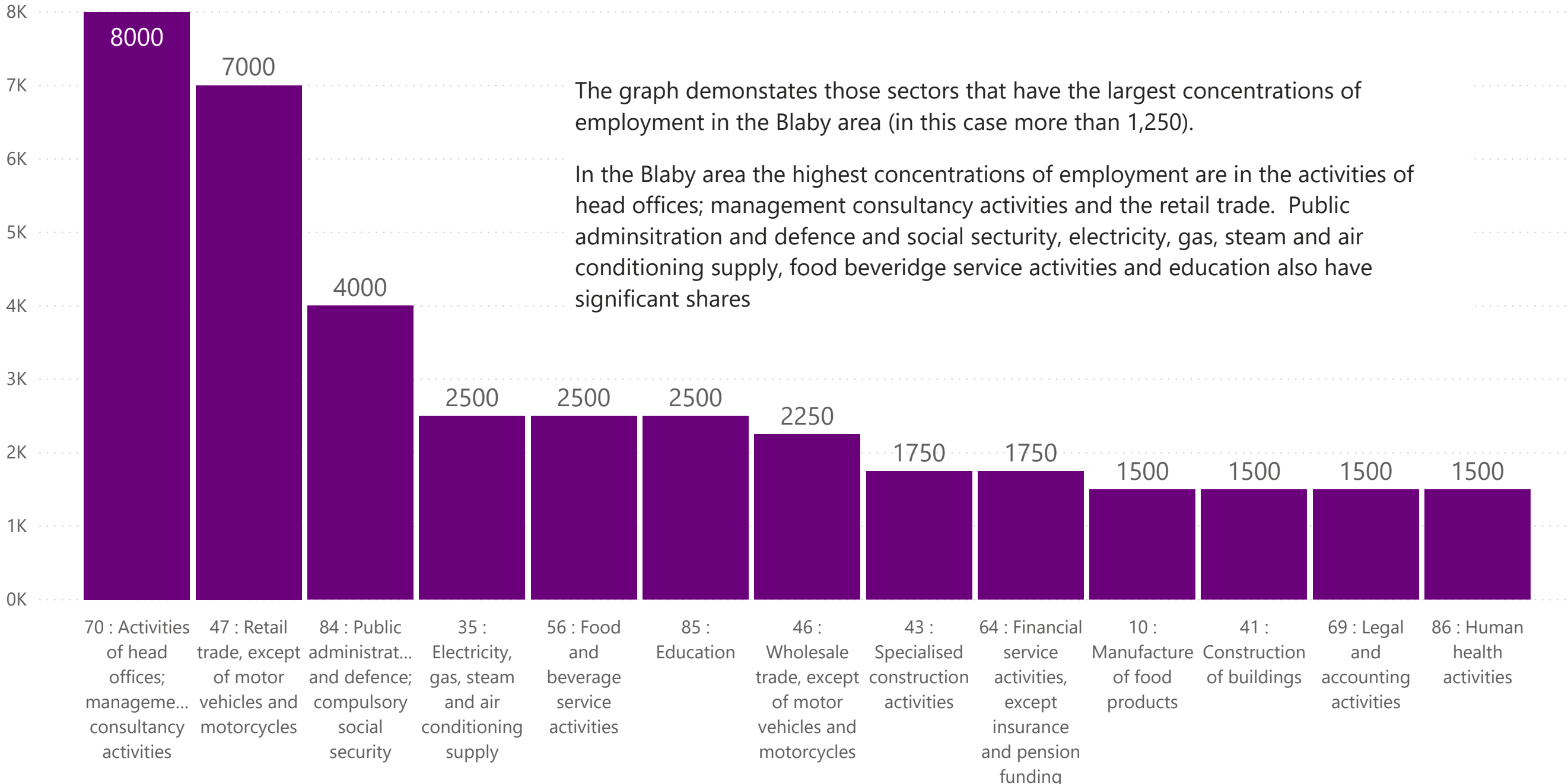

# Employment Numbers by Sector - Blaby

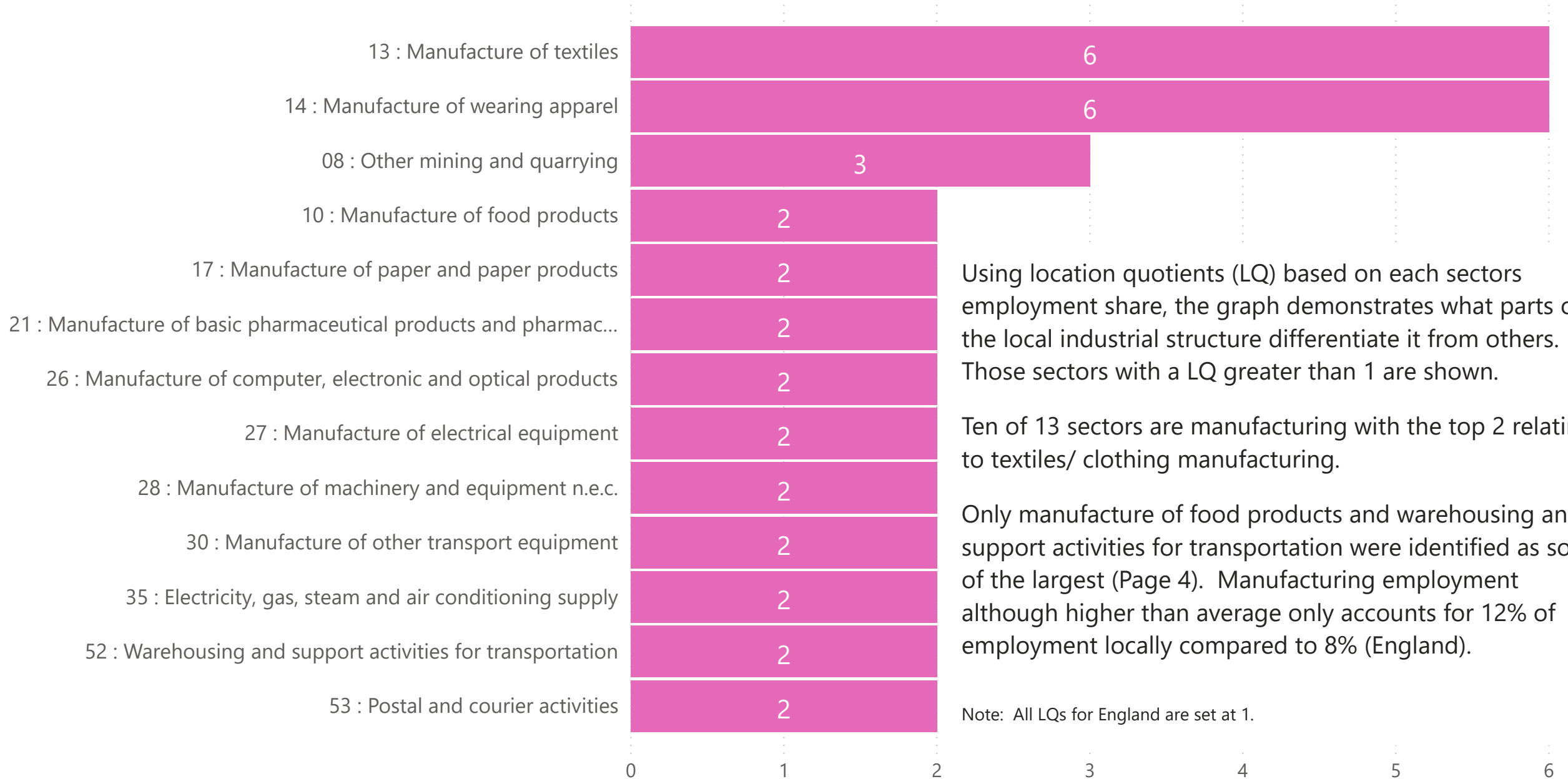


The graph demonstrates those sectors that have the largest concentrations of employment in the Blaby area (in this case more than 1,250).

In the Blaby area the highest concentrations of employment are in the activities of head offices; management consultancy activities and the retail trade. Public administration and defence and social security, electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply, food beverage service activities and education also have significant shares

# What differentiates the LLEP Area when comparing it to others?

Using location quotients (LQ) based on each sectors employment share, the graph demonstrates what parts of the local industrial structure differentiate it from others. Those sectors with a LQ greater than 1 are shown.

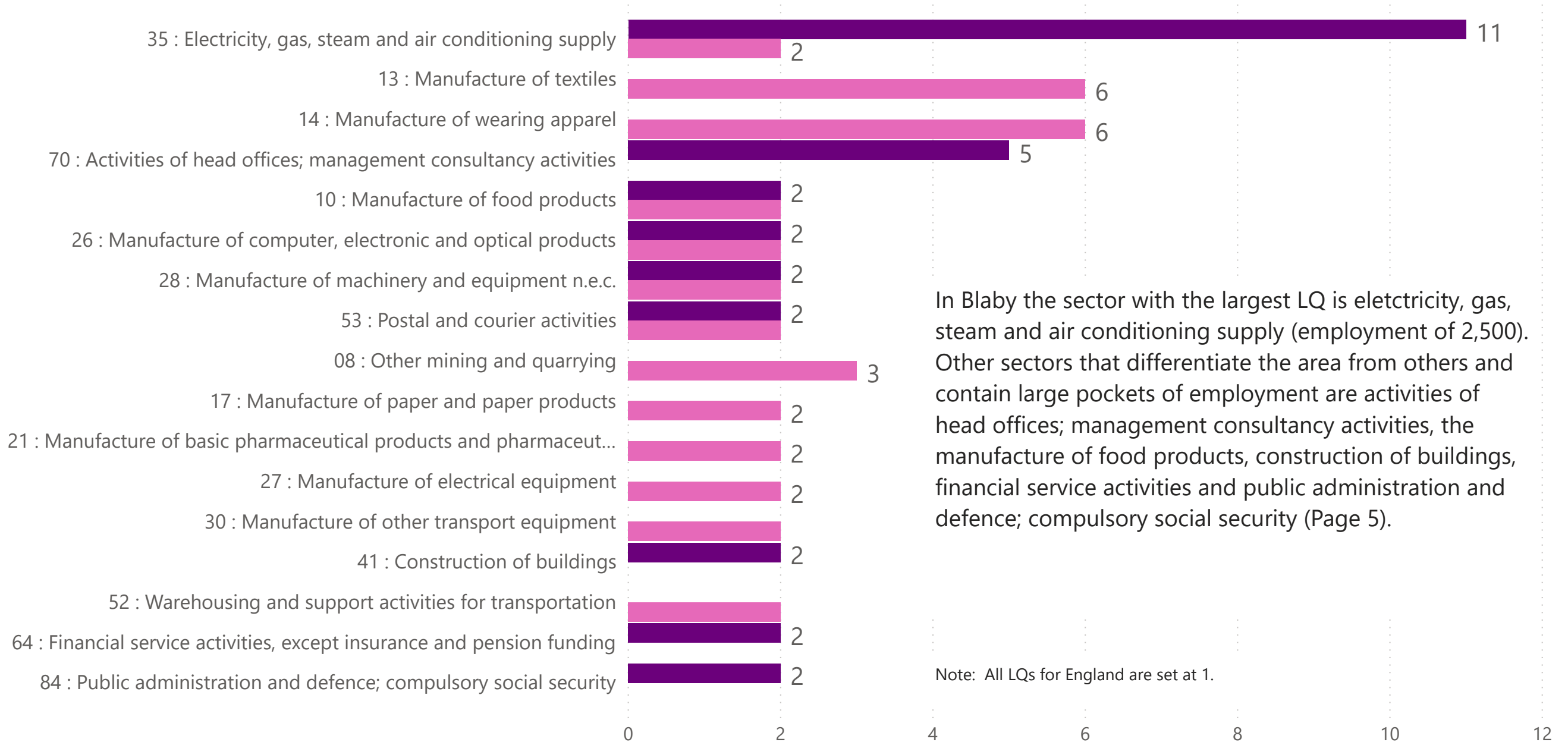
Ten of 13 sectors are manufacturing with the top 2 relating to textiles/ clothing manufacturing.

Only manufacture of food products and warehousing and support activities for transportation were identified as some of the largest (Page 4). Manufacturing employment although higher than average only accounts for 12% of employment locally compared to 8% (England).

# What differentiates the Blaby area when comparing it to others?

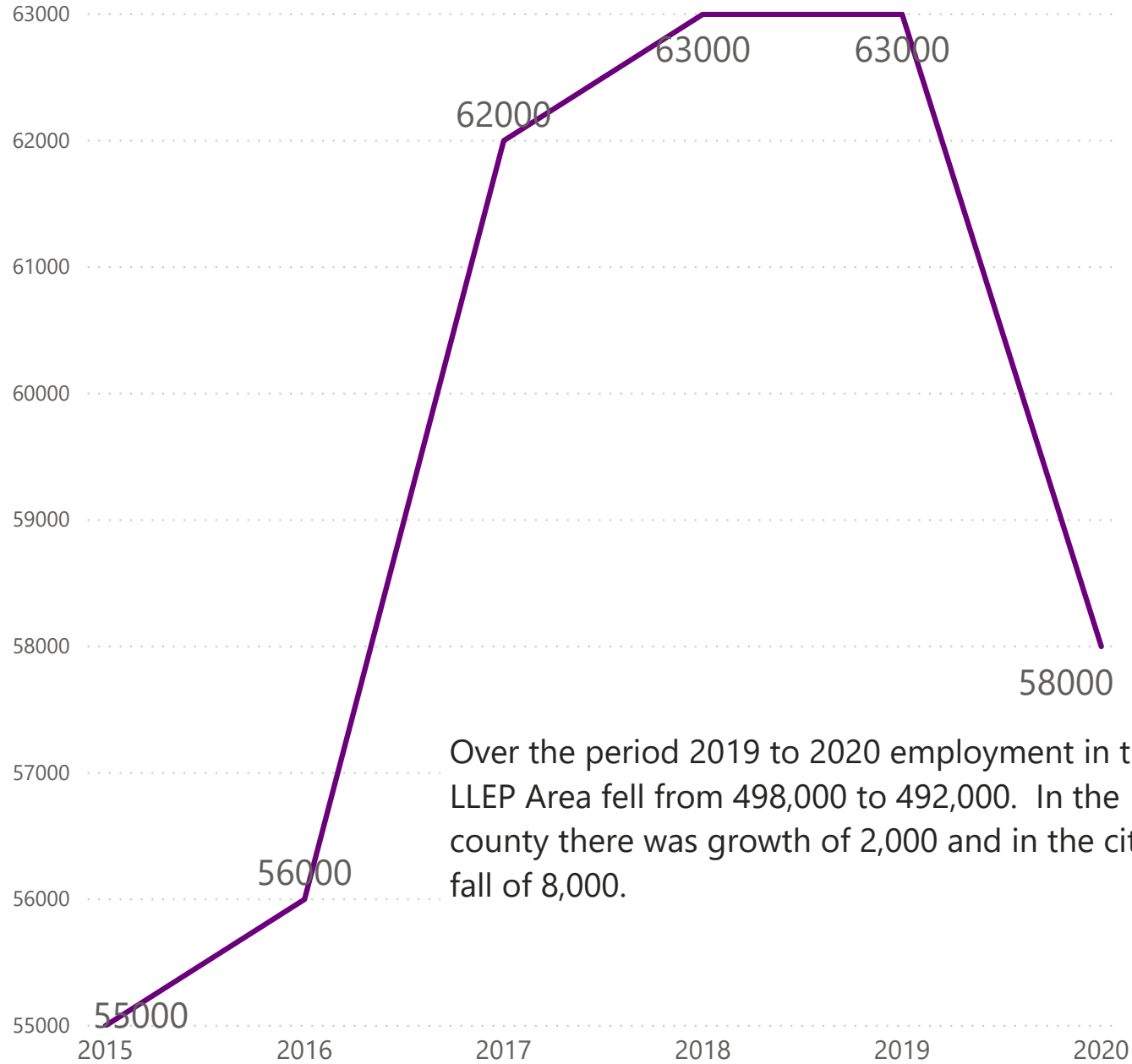


In Blaby the sector with the largest LQ is electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (employment of 2,500). Other sectors that differentiate the area from others and contain large pockets of employment are activities of head offices; management consultancy activities, the manufacture of food products, construction of buildings, financial service activities and public administration and defence; compulsory social security (Page 5).

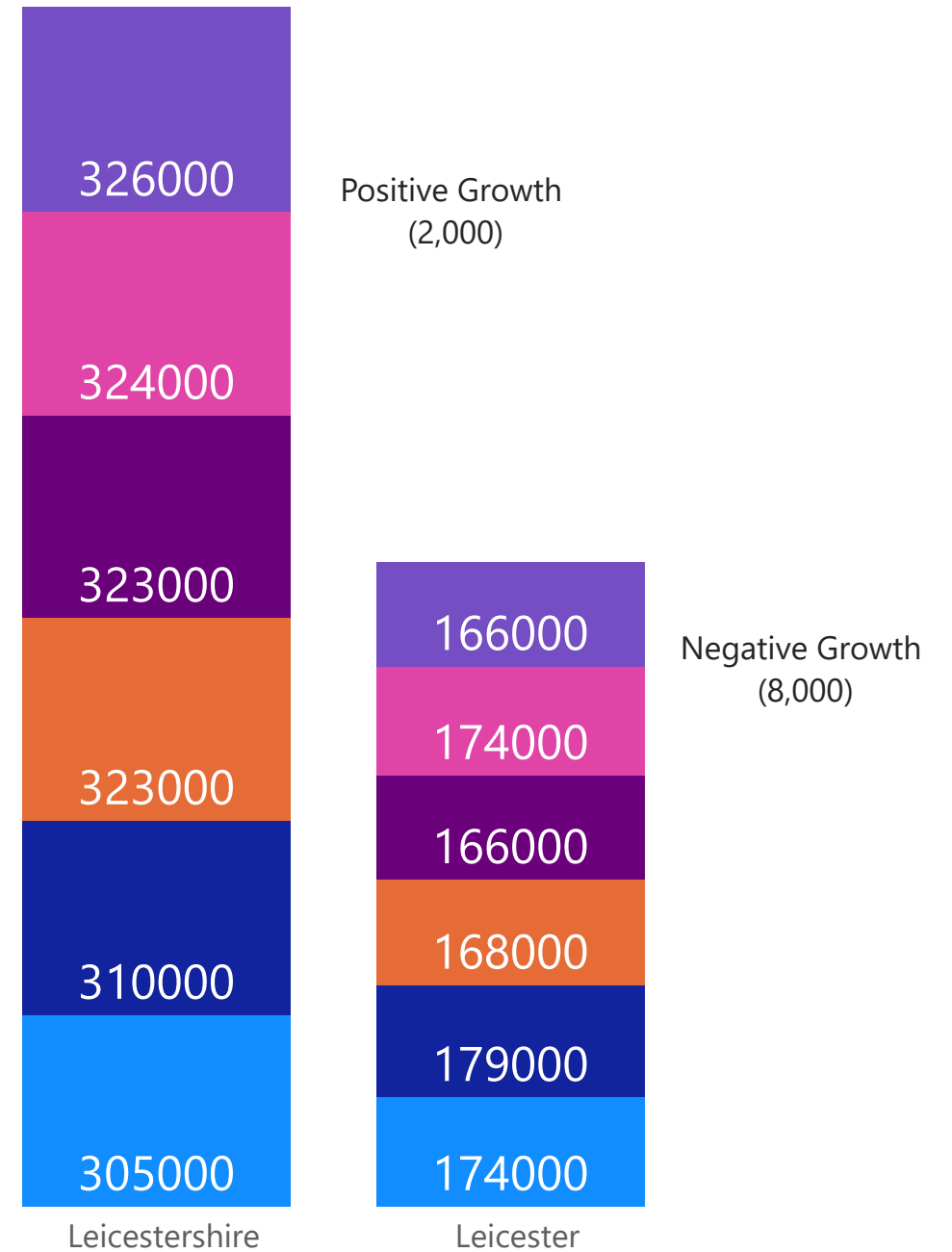
# Employment Growth

Area ● Blaby



Over the period 2019 to 2020 employment in the LLEP Area fell from 498,000 to 492,000. In the county there was growth of 2,000 and in the city a fall of 8,000.

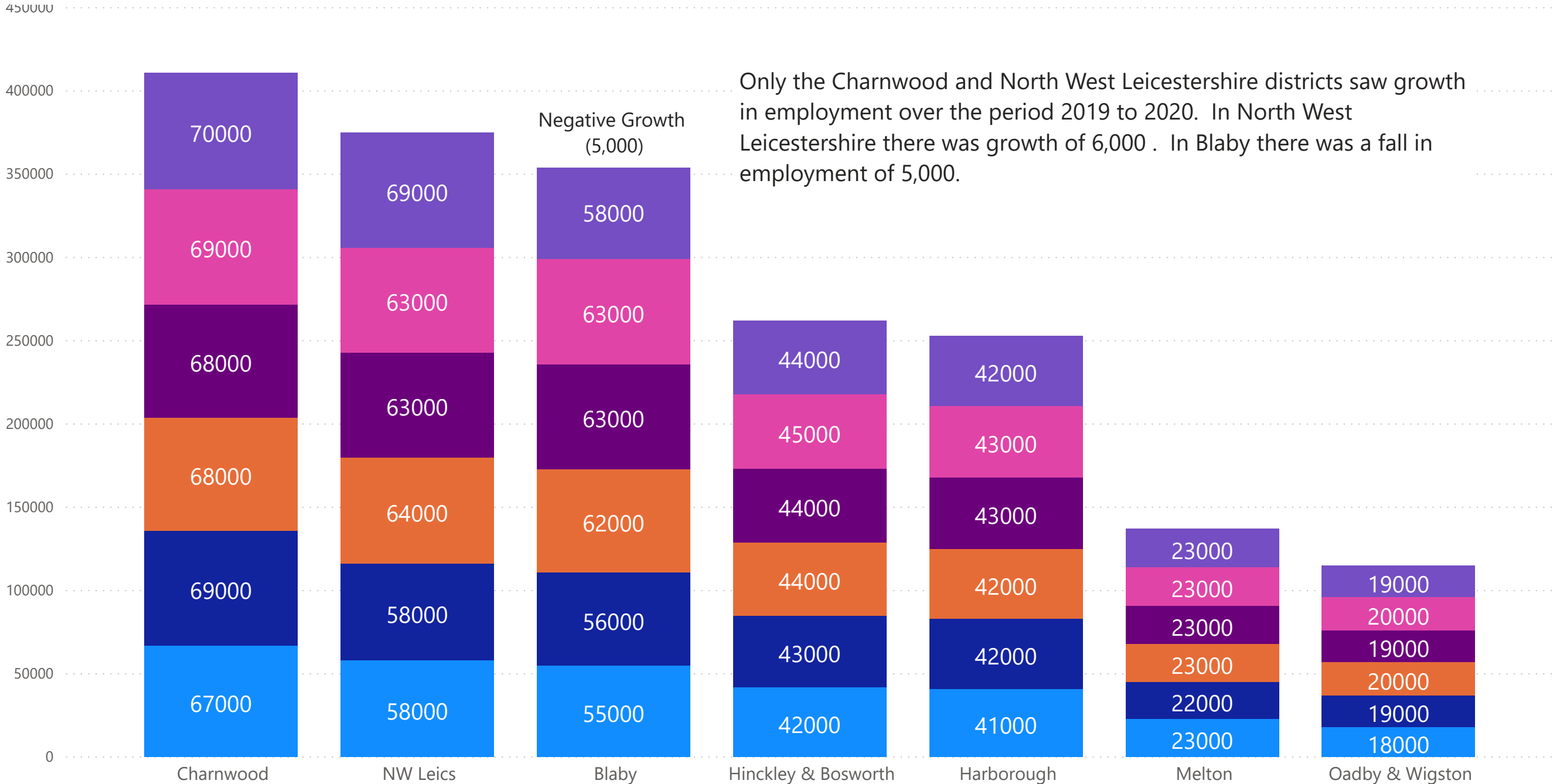

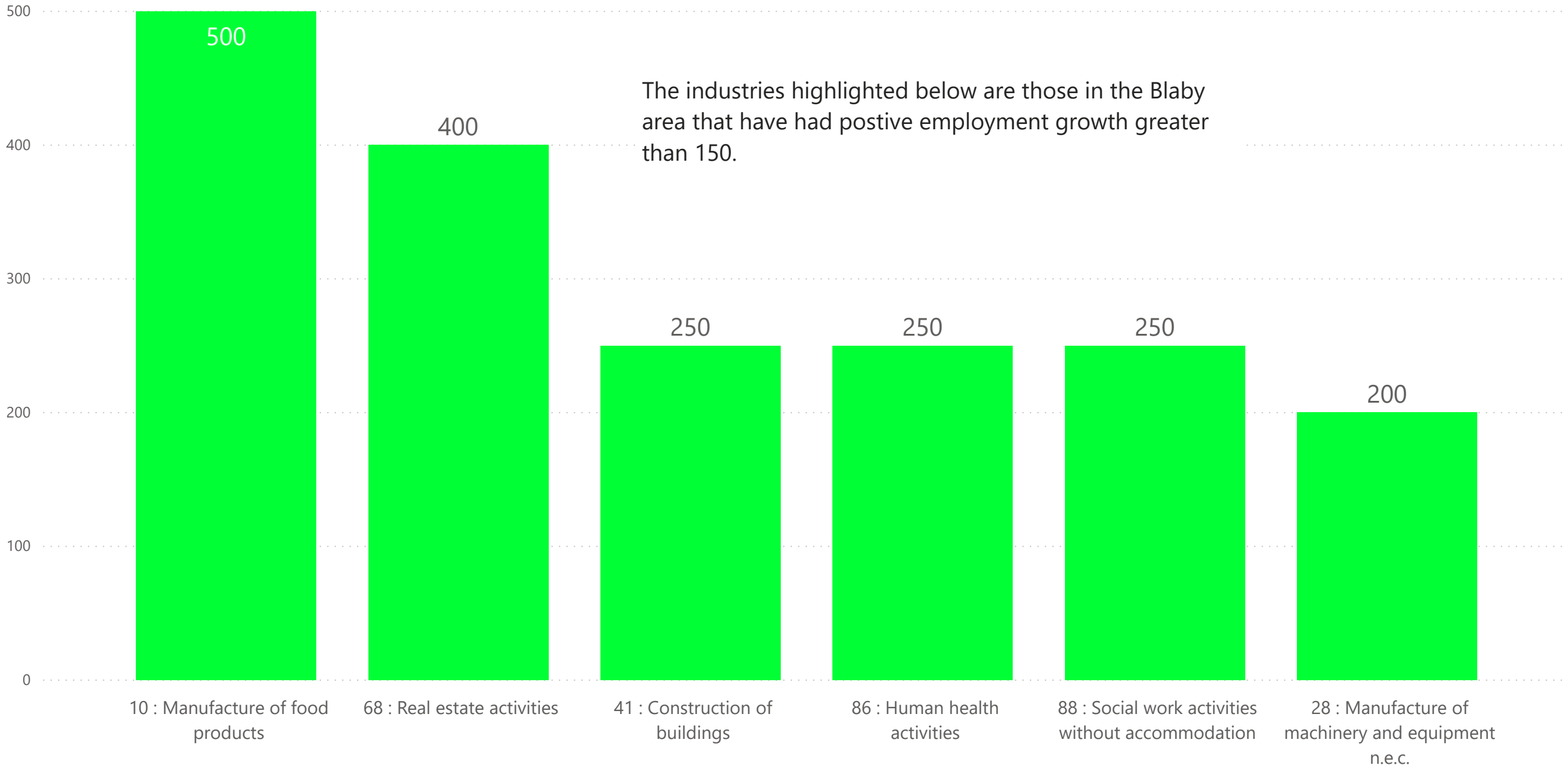


# Positive Employment Growth (2019 - 2020) - LLEP Area

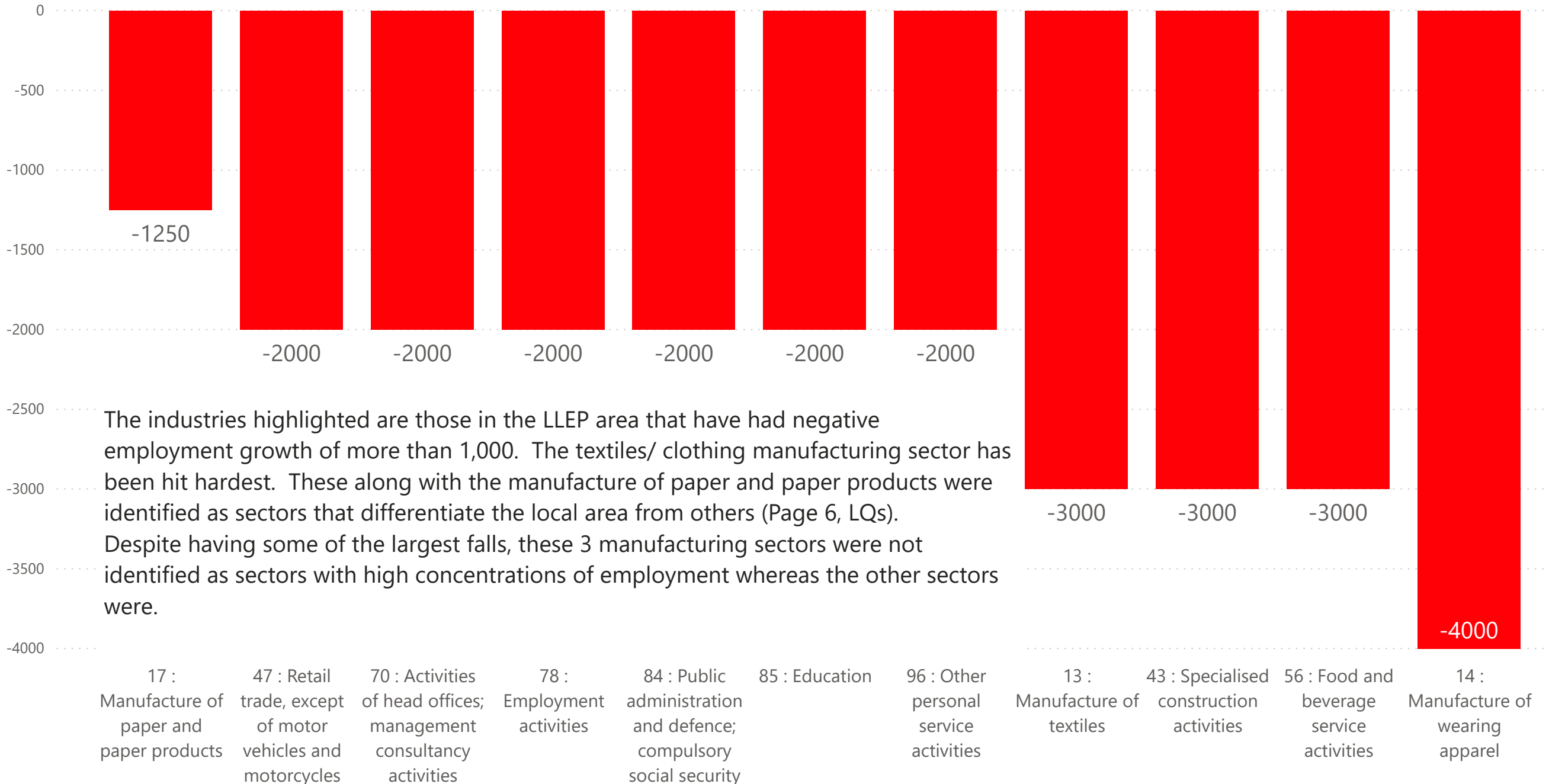
The industries highlighted below are those in the LLEP area that have had positive employment growth of more than 1,000. In the case of warehousing and support activities for transportation this was growth of 7,000. On Page 4 warehousing and support activities for transportation and manufacture of food products were identified as sectors with the largest concentrations of employment in the LLEP Area. On Page 6 they were also identified as sectors that differentiate the local area from others.
