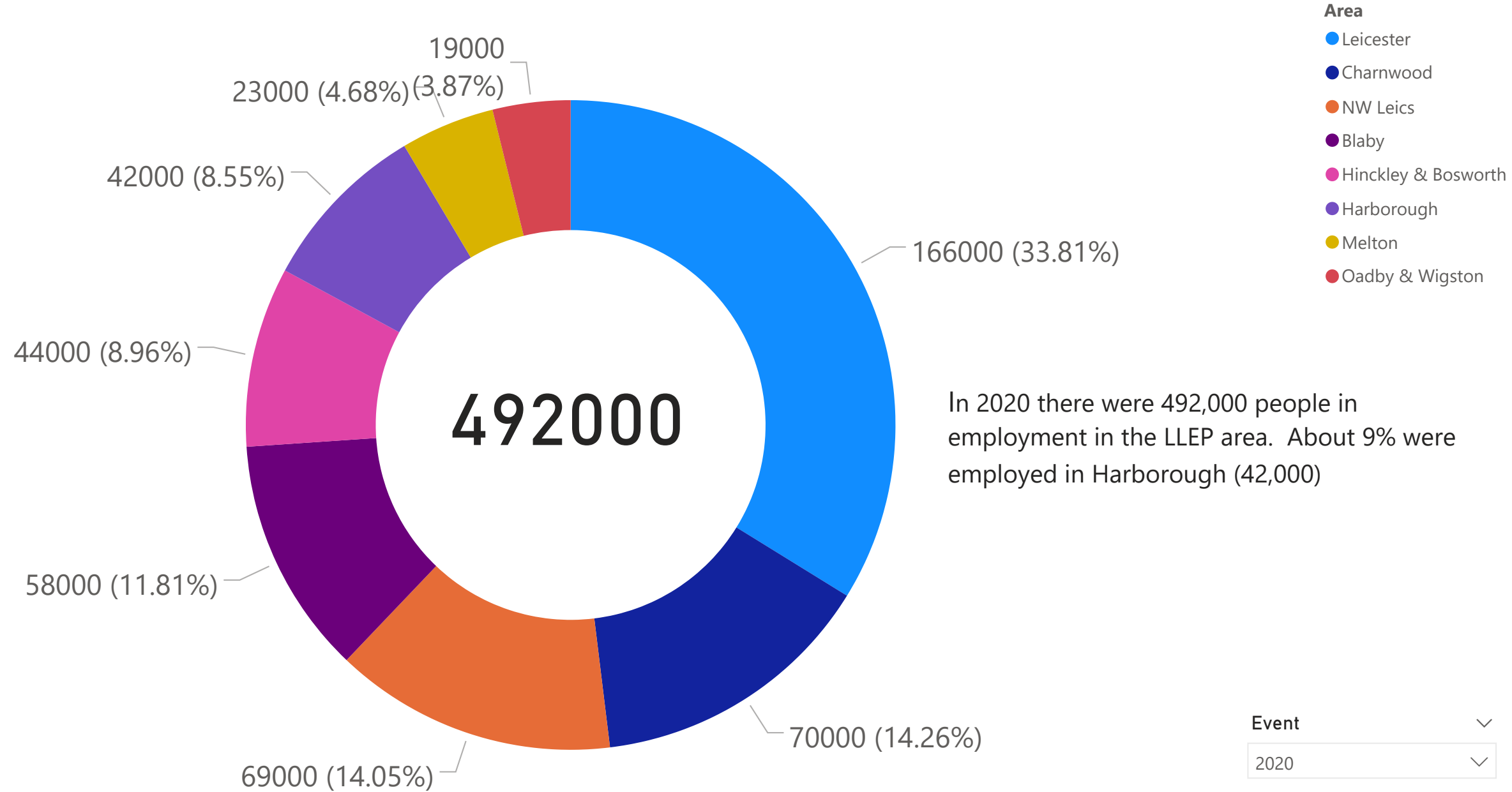
Initial Breakdown - Harborough

The Business Register and Employment Survey (BRES) provides employee and employment estimates at detailed geographical and industrial levels and is regarded as the definitive source of official government employee statistics by industry. The latest data released in November 2021 relates to 2020 and provides an insight into the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic on industry and related employment. Data is at a 2 digit level (Standard Industrial Code).

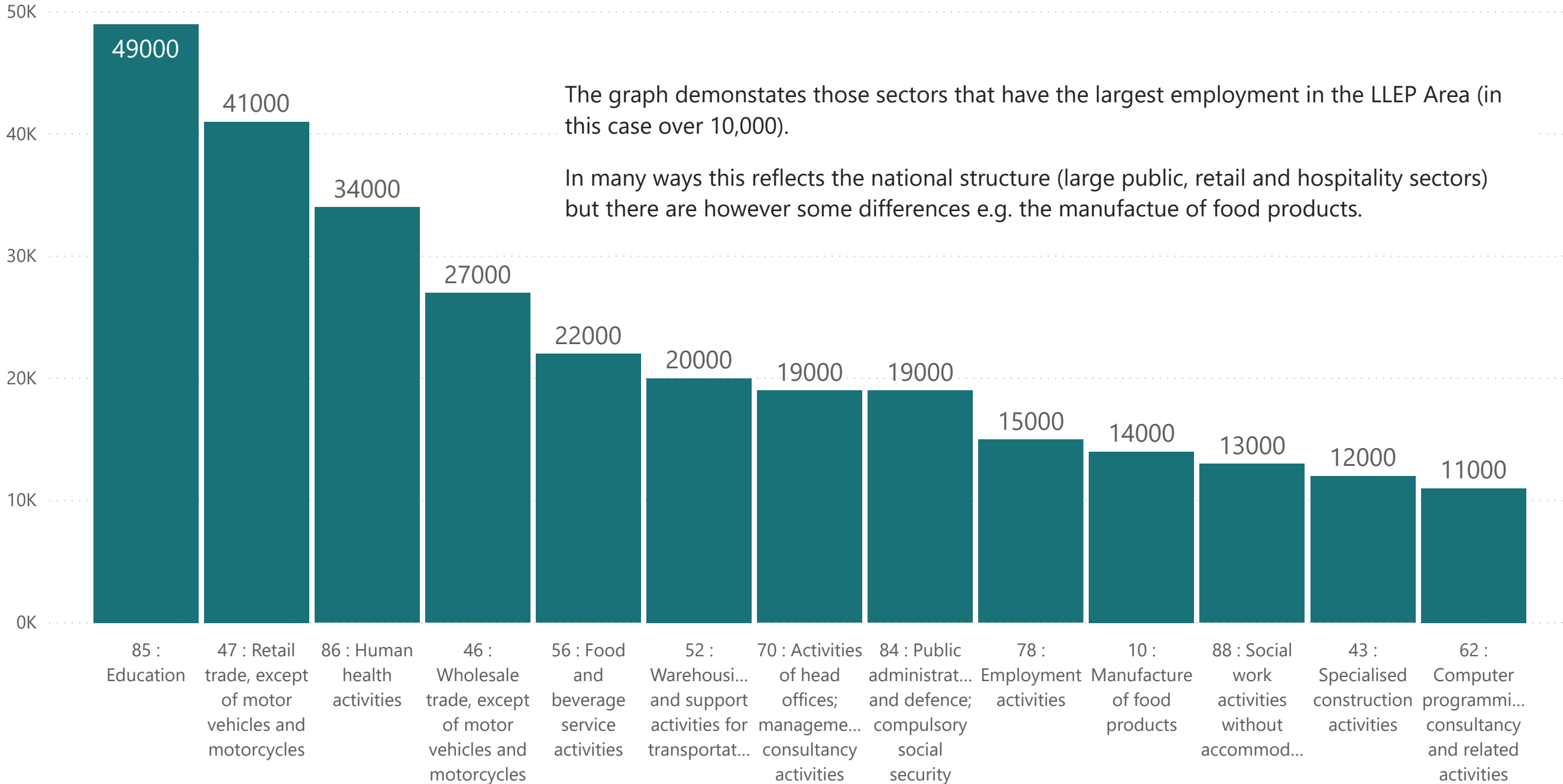

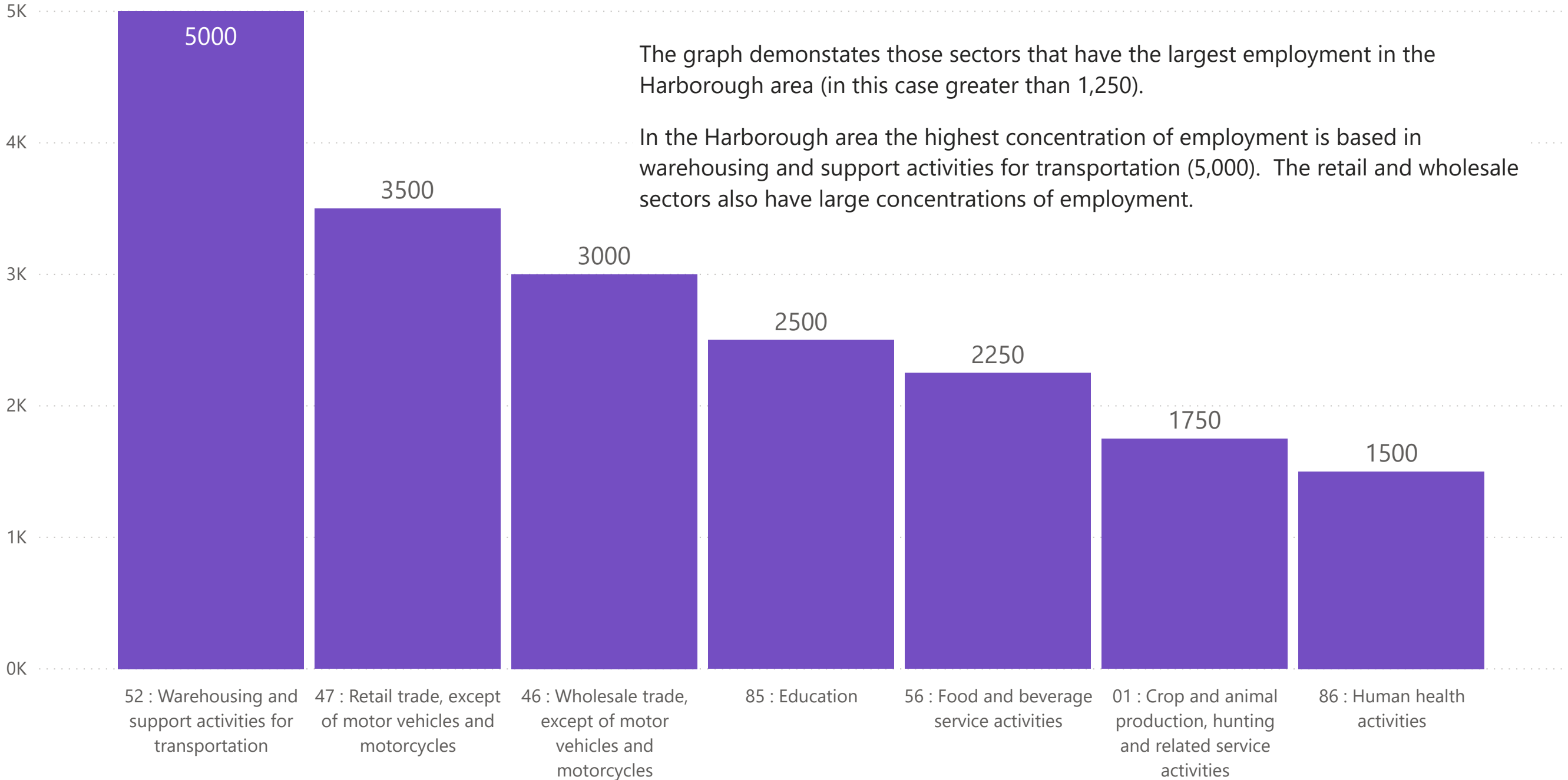
Employment and Geographical Share



Employment Numbers by Sector - LLEP Area

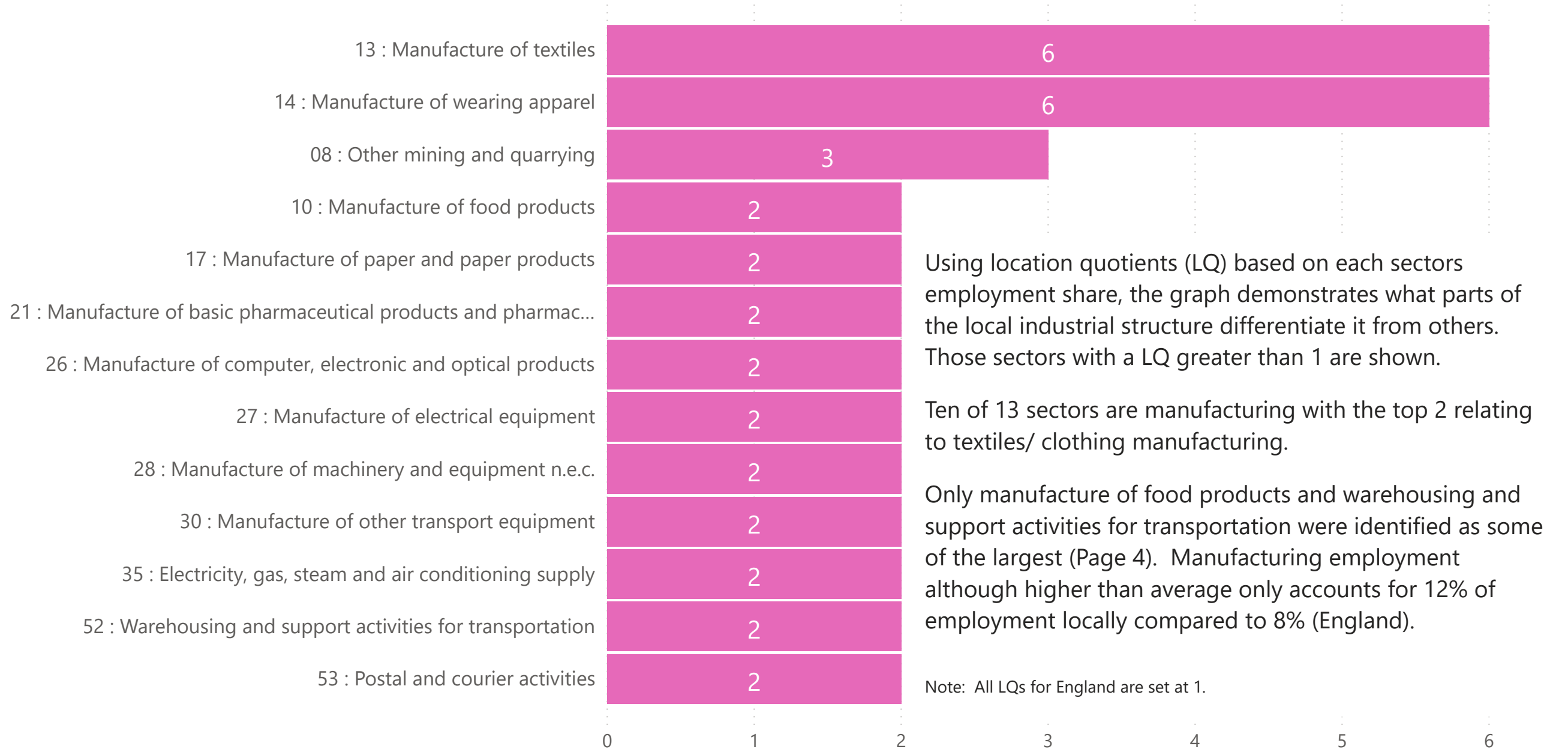


Employment Numbers by Sector - Harborough



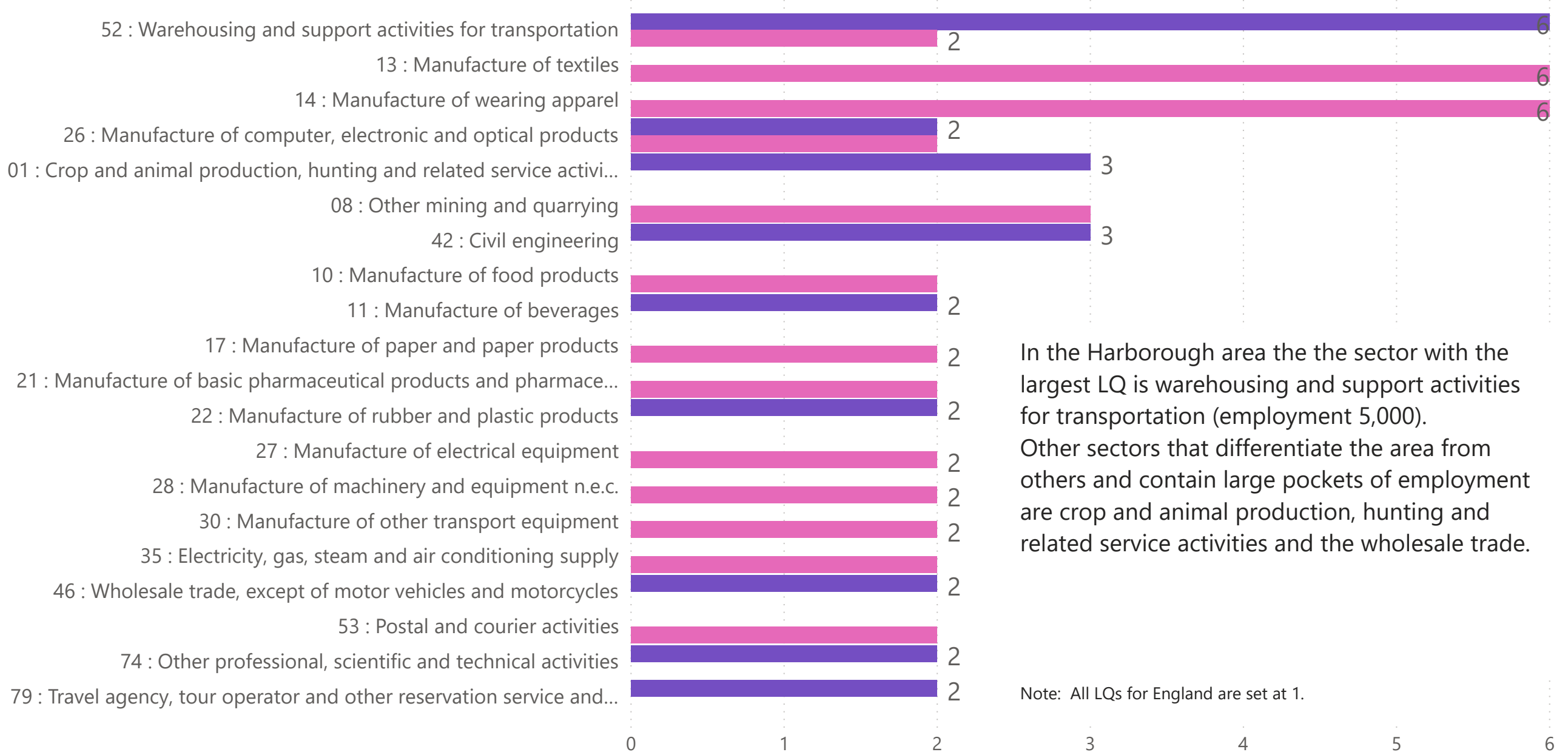
What differentiates the LLEP Area when comparing it to others?

Area ● Harborough ● LLEP Area

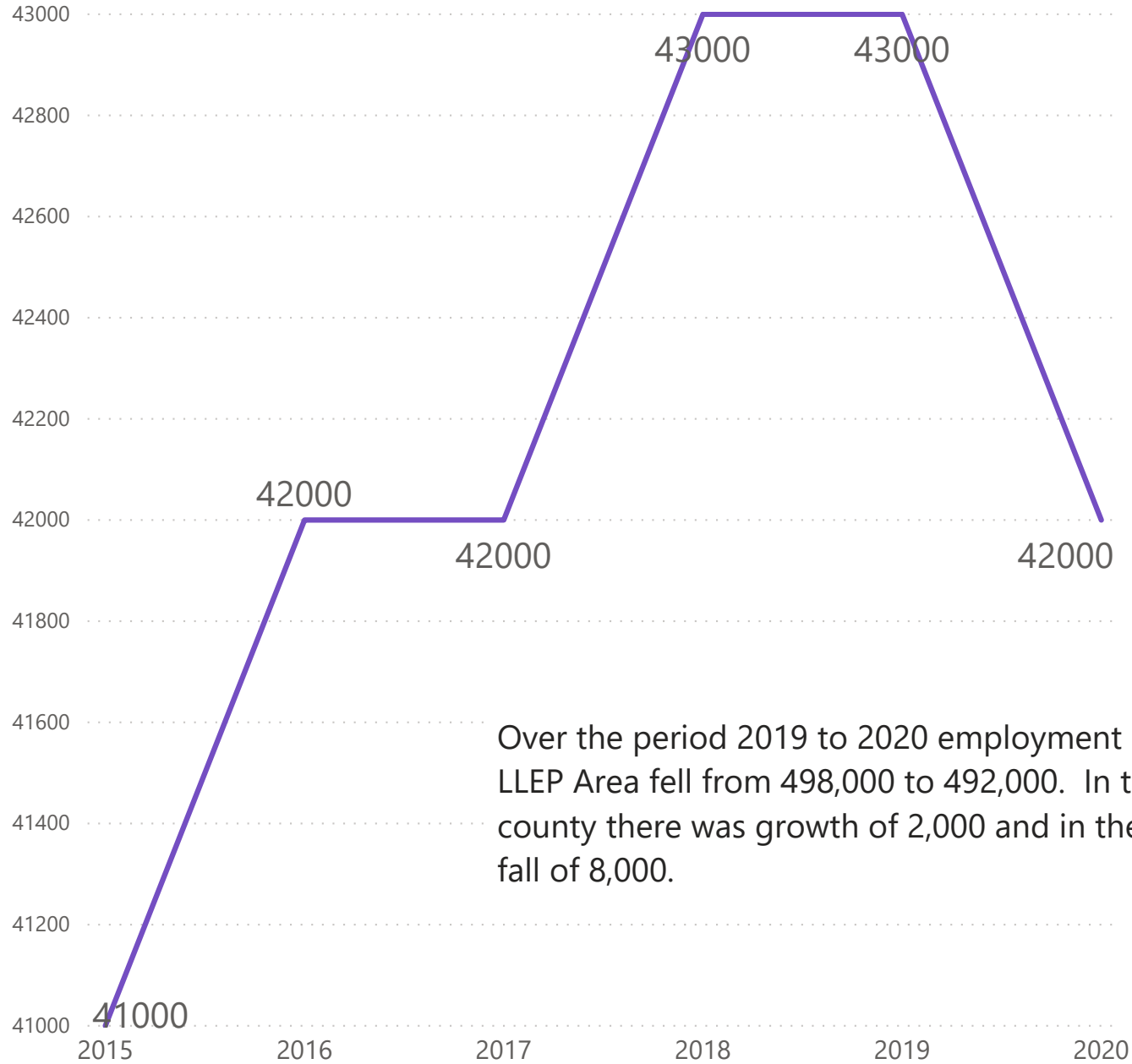


In the Harborough area the the sector with the largest LQ is warehousing and support activities for transportation (employment 5,000). Other sectors that differentiate the area from others and contain large pockets of employment are crop and animal production, hunting and related service activities and the wholesale trade.

Note: All LQs for England are set at 1.

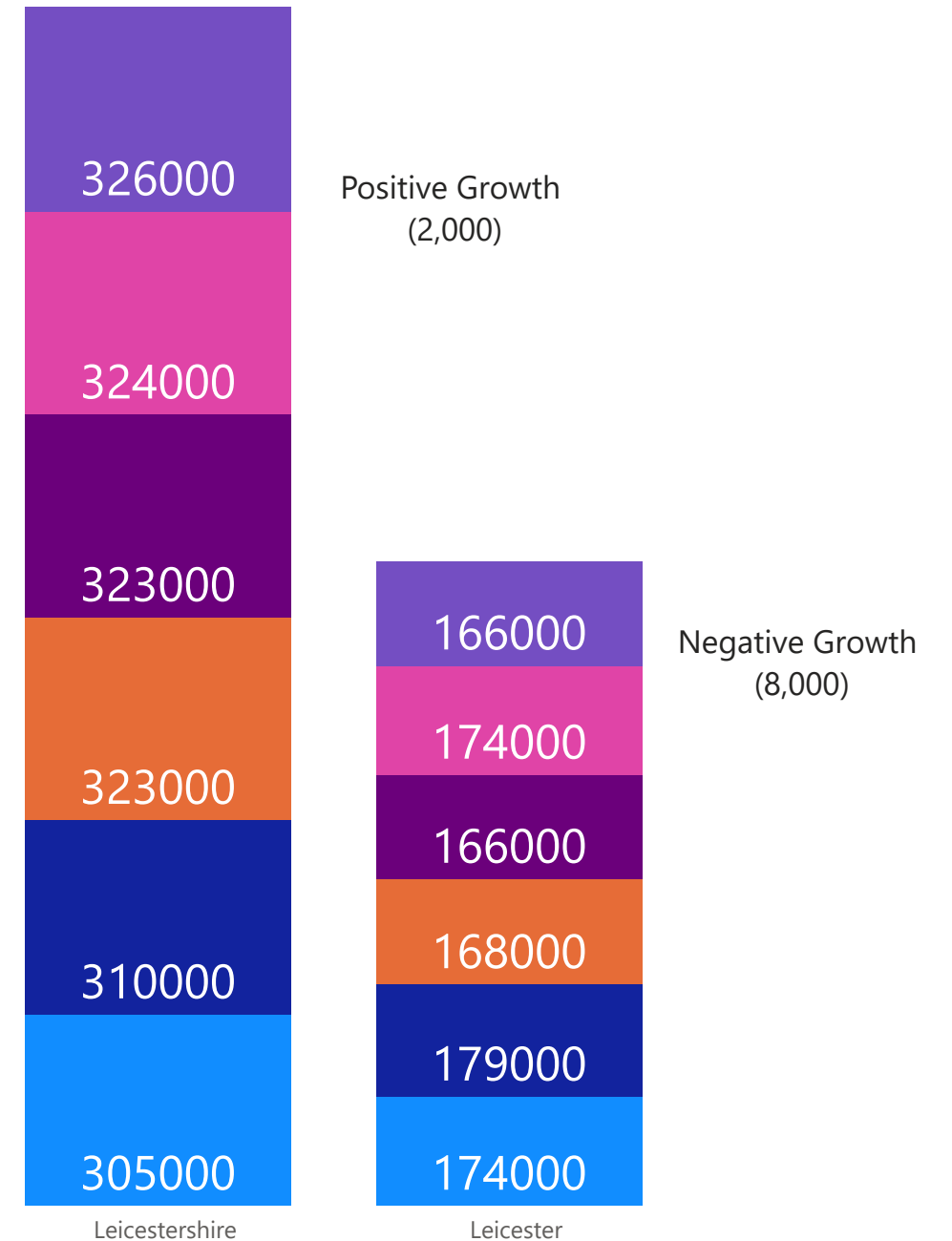
Employment Growth

Area ● Harborough



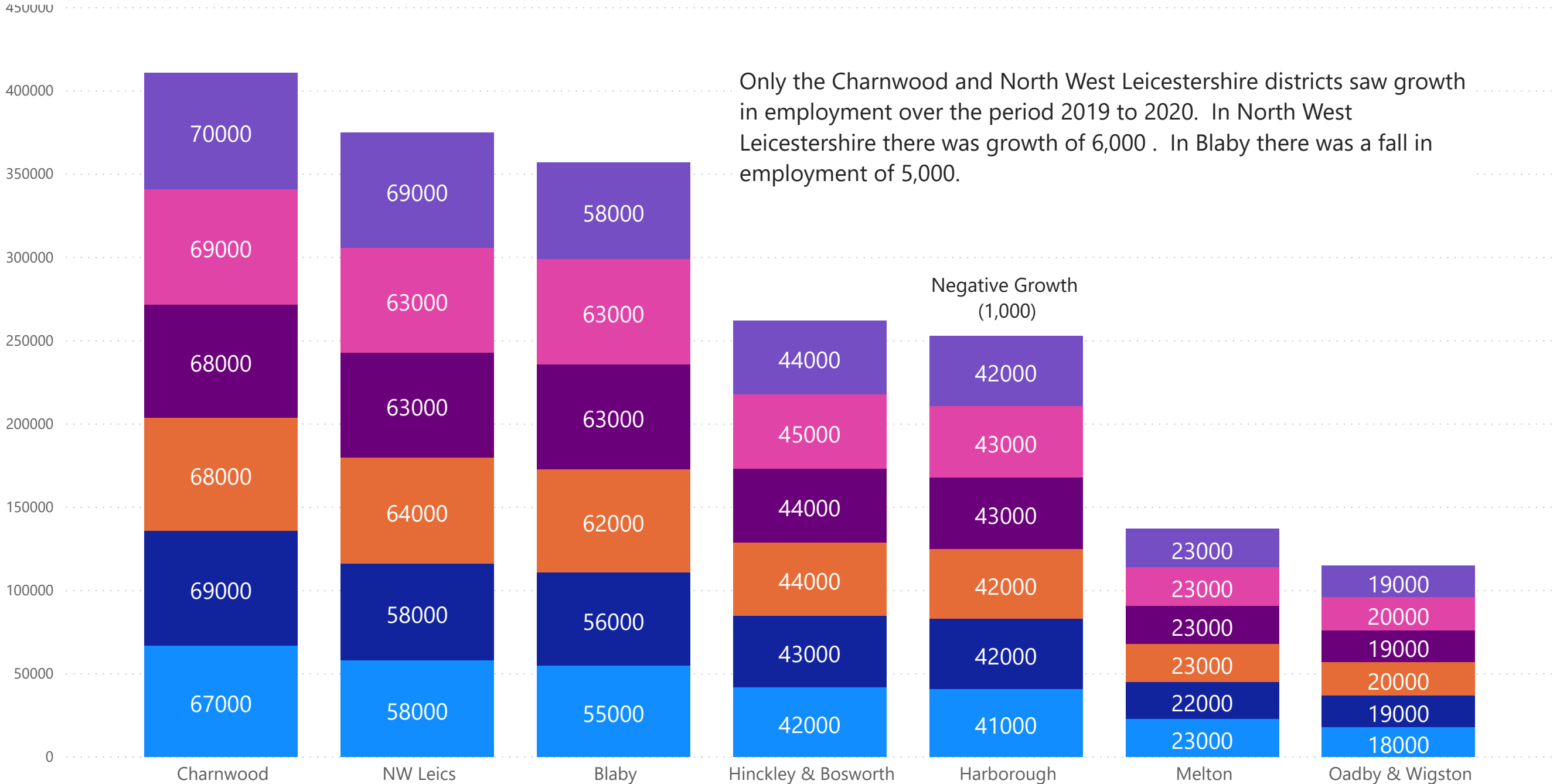
Over the period 2019 to 2020 employment in the LLEP Area fell from 498,000 to 492,000. In the county there was growth of 2,000 and in the city a fall of 8,000.

● 2015 ● 2016 ● 2017 ● 2018 ● 2019 ● 2020

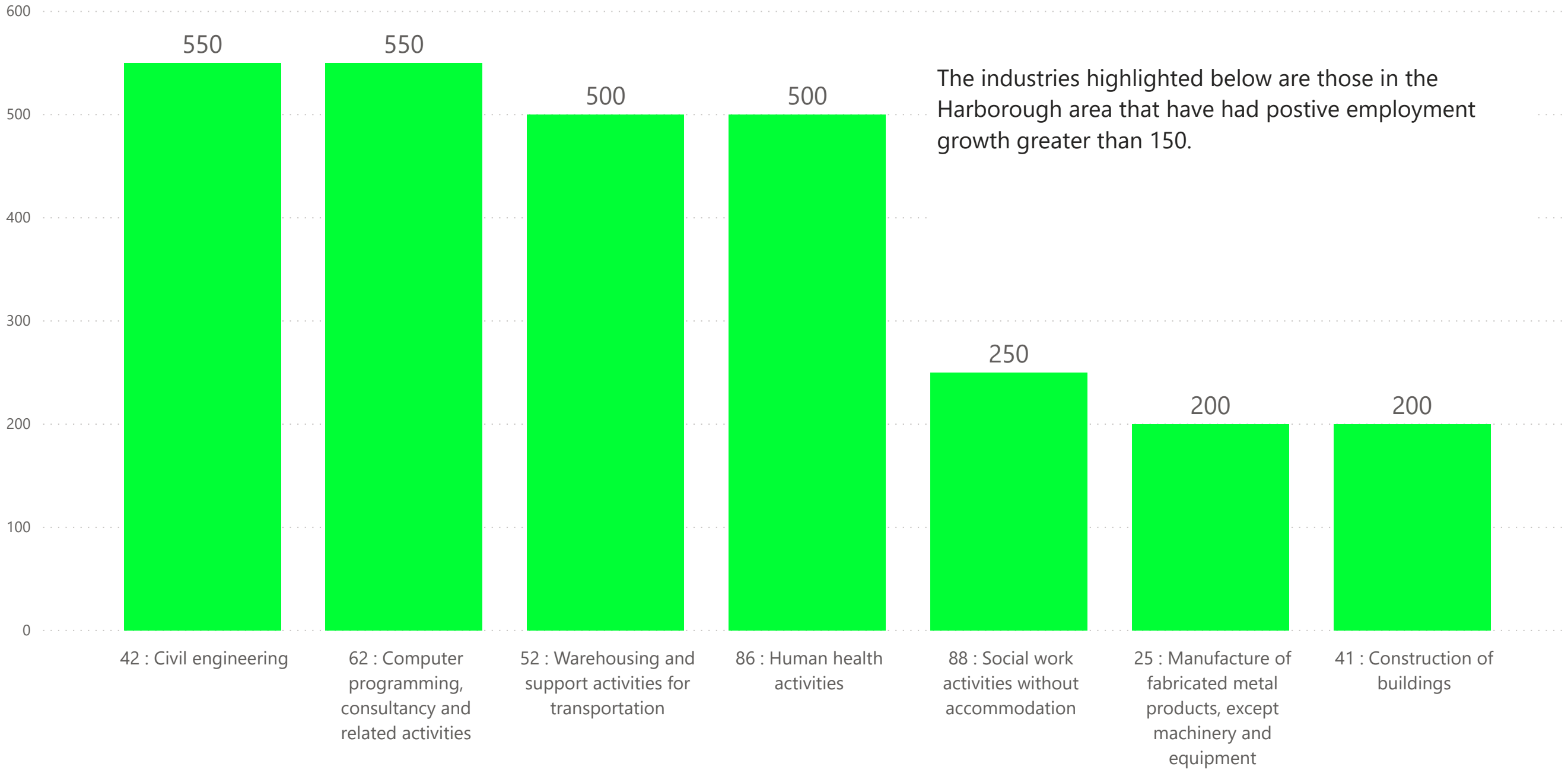


Positive Employment Growth (2019 - 2020) - LLEP Area

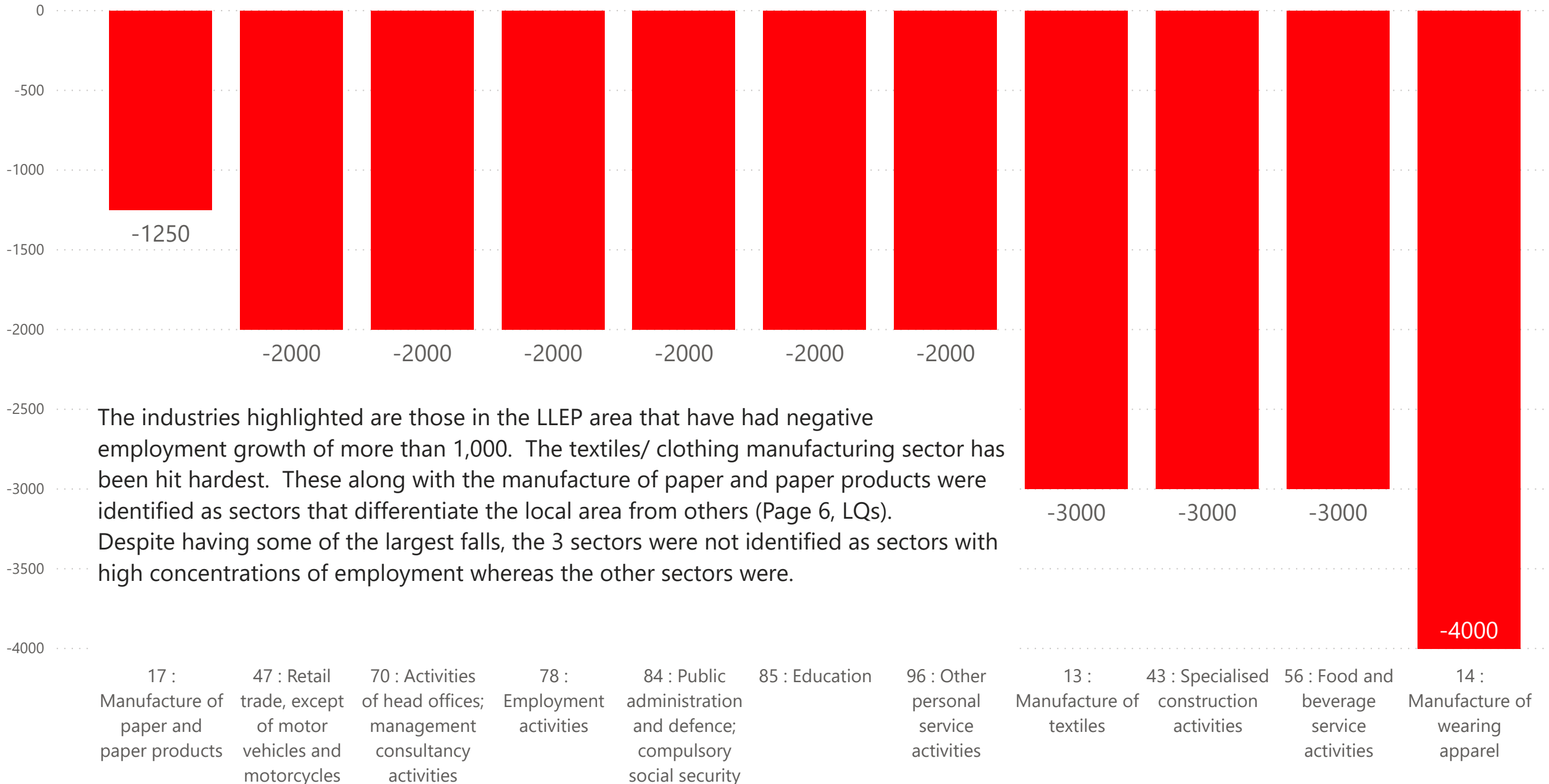
The industries highlighted below are those in the LLEP area that have had positive employment growth of more than 1,000. In the case of warehousing and support activities for transportation this was growth of 7,000. On Page 4 warehousing and support activities for transportation and manufacture of food products were identified as sectors with the largest concentrations of employment in the LLEP Area. On Page 6 they were also identified as sectors that differentiate the local area from others.



Positive Employment Growth (2019 - 2020) - Harborough

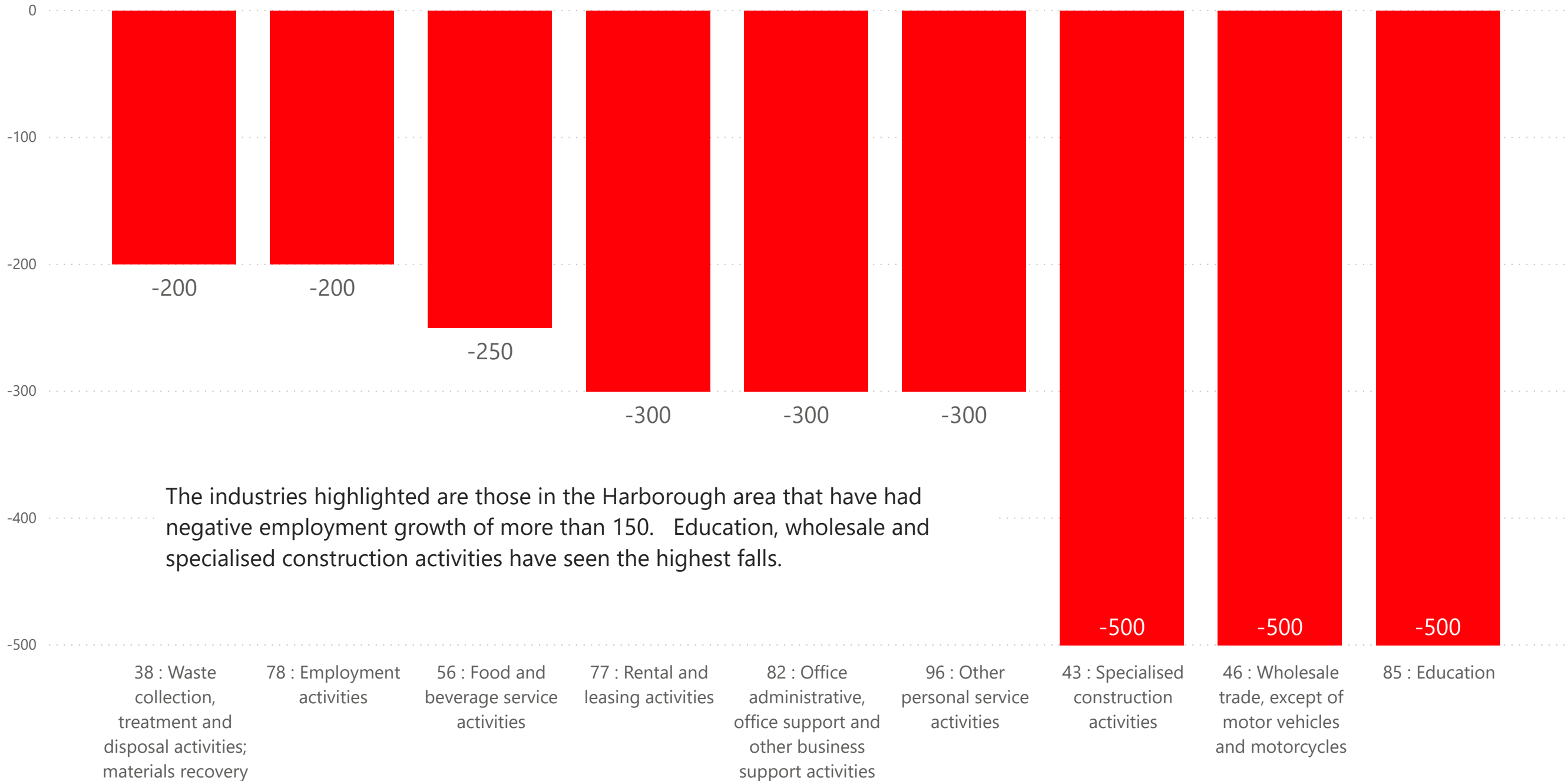


Negative Employment Growth (2019 - 2020) - LLEP Area



The industries highlighted are those in the LLEP area that have had negative employment growth of more than 1,000. The textiles/ clothing manufacturing sector has been hit hardest. These along with the manufacture of paper and paper products were identified as sectors that differentiate the local area from others (Page 6, LQs). Despite having some of the largest falls, the 3 sectors were not identified as sectors with high concentrations of employment whereas the other sectors were.
