
Initial Breakdown - Harborough

The latest data released in November 2021 relates to 2020 and provides an insight into the impact of the Covid 19 pandemic on industry and related employment. Data is at a 2 digit level (Standard Industrial Code).




Employment and Geographical Share






Employment Growth






Employment Growth Districts




Positive Employment Growth (2019 - 2020) - LLEP Area

-2500 The industries highlighted are those in the LLEP area that have had negative employment growth of more than 1,000. The textiles/ clothing manufacturing sector has been hit hardest. These along with the manufacture of paper and paper products were -3000 identified as sectors that differentiate the local area from others (Page 6, LQs). Despite having some of the largest falls, the 3 sectors were not identified as sectors with -3500 high concentrations of employment whereas the other sectors were.


