What are Digital Skills and why do you need them?

Digital Skills include anything from searching the internet to programming a robot; **from keeping an accounts spreadsheet to building a website.**

One thing for sure is that digital skills can make your staff more efficient and more productive, from the simplest tasks to the most complex. That means driving your costs down and increasing turnover for your business overall.

Research suggests that over **75%** of advertised jobs require a level of digital skills.

Case study

"I have to use a device which monitors speed and efficiency when picking and packing items ordered by customers online. I struggled when logging-in and updating records. My attendance and time keeping was good, I work hard, and my boss says my attitude is great...but my monthly report flagged my performance as 'RED – requiring improvement'. After some basic digital training, work has become less stressful and I'm getting more done."



Digital Skills in the workplace

Digital Skills is not all about complicated software or expensive system. **Many businesses make gains by making better use of the software that they already have**, for example Microsoft Office. The skills most people need are not complex or difficult to gain. Sending your staff on basic training or taking on a freshly trained recruit could help you make productivity gains. **There are lots of short courses available at Leicestershire's local colleges and training providers.**

Specialist skills

Your business might also need some more specialist IT skills. Salaries for these roles can be quite high but there may be other ways to tackle this:

- Train your existing staff to move into these roles via local Colleges, Training Providers, Universities or Skills Bootcamps
- Higher-level apprenticeships could be taken by experienced members of your staff, increasing their skills levels
- Consider a placement student to bring fresh skills without a long-term commitment:
 - T-Level student from a local college or a University placement
