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1. Economic Roundup

A summary of some key announcements since the last update together with a round-up of recently published research and insights from a range of organisations.

2. Claimant Count

In June 2023 the claimant rate in the Leicester and Leicestershire area was 3.3%. This translates to 22,390 claimants. In May the figure was 3.2% (21,915). At a national level the claimant rate in England was 3.8%. This is 0.5 of a percentage point higher than the local figure.

The picture is very different in the city and county with Leicester having a claimant rate of 5.2% and Leicestershire 2.2%. This is a difference of 3 percentage points. Leicester's claimant rate is 1.4 percentage points higher than the England average (3.8%) and Leicestershire's 1.6 percentage points lower.




Figure 1: LLEP Area Claimant Rate (%) June 2022 – June 2023 Source: ONS




Figure 2: LLEP Area Claimant Rate (%) June 2020 - June 2023 Source: ONS

Figure 2 below provides an annual comparator for the Leicester and Leicestershire area and compares this with regional and national figures.

Of the 22,390 claimants over half (57.1% or 12,790) were based in Leicester and 9,600 or 42.9% in Leicestershire.

In March 2020 the claimant rate was 2.3% (or 15,145). Between March 2020 and the end of June 2023 the claimant rate increased by a percentage point to 3.3% (22,390). This translates to an additional 7,245 claimants or a percentage increase of 47.8%.




Figure 3: LLEP Area Claimant Count June 2022 – June 2023 Source: ONS

In the Leicester and Leicestershire area over the period March to August 2020 the number of claimants grew from 15,145 to 36,025 (it's peak locally). This was a rise of 20,880 claimants or 138%. When comparing the figures for August 2020 and June 2023 against those for March 2020, the difference has fallen from 20,880 to 7,245. Since June 2022 the number of claimants has risen by 1,240 (from 21,150).

Figure 11 later in the report, demonstrates the claimant rate over the period January 2020 to June 2023 and the number of unique job postings (for the same period).




Figure 4: LLEP Area Claimant Forecast Average to June 2024 Source Data: ONS




Figure 5: LLEP Area Claimant Rate Forecast, 3, 5, 8 and Forecast Average, June 2024 Source Data: ONS

Figures 4 and 5 below project claimant numbers forward to the end of June 2024. Projections are based on the last 3, 5 and 8 months and an average of these. This helps to identify the direction of travel in relation to claimant numbers. The average figure for June 2024 is 24,237 or 3.5%. This is above the pre-pandemic level of 2.3%. Figures continue to demonstrate an upward trend in claimant numbers. Recent projections however have demonstrated smaller projected claimant numbers/rates.

Note: Forecasts are linear, claimant numbers however are governed by a variety of events both foreseen and unforeseen, as such forecast data should be treated with caution.

In relation to age figures for June 2023 these demonstrate that there were on average a larger share of 25-49 years olds (3.8%) than 18-24 years olds (3.6%) and claimants that were 50 and over (2.6%). The national claimant rate for 18–24-year-olds (4.8%), 25–49-year-olds (4.3%) and those are 50+ (2.8%) is higher nationally than locally.




Figure 6: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Age (%) June 2022 – June 2023 Source: ONS




Figure 7: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Claimants Aged 18-24 (%) June 2022 – June 2023 Source: ONS

Twelve thousand four hundred and ninety-five (55.8%) claimants were male and 9,895 (44.2%) were female.




Figure 8: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Gender (%) June 2022 – June 2023 Source: ONS




Figure 9: LLEP Area Claimant Count June 2015 – June 2023 Source: ONS

3. Universal Credit Claimants

Universal Credit claimants are placed in a conditionality group based on their circumstances and work capability. This determines what is expected of them during their claim.

Over the last month (May to June) the numbers searching, planning, or preparing for work has risen from 27,552 to 28,298. The numbers who are working has risen from 33,779 to 33,888.

From June 2022 those searching, planning, or preparing for work has risen by 2,441 (from 25,857). Over the same period those with no work requirements grew by 7,557 (22,868 to 30,425).

Since March 2020 there has been a significant rise in the number of people who are not seeking work/ have no work requirements with numbers more than doubling during the period. In March 2020, the figure was 10,997 and in June 2023 it was 30,425 (a rise of 19,428 or 177%). Over the last year those not seeking work/ have no work requirements has grown by 5.3 percentage points.




Figure 10: LLEP Area Universal Credit Claimant Count by Conditionality Group March 2020 – June 2023

4. Relationships

The figure below demonstrates the relationship between the claimant count and unique job postings. Data is for the period January 2020 onwards in the Leicester and Leicestershire area.

In June there was a rise in the number of unique job postings (38,855 to 40,842). The claimant rate over the same period in the Leicester and Leicestershire area has increased to 3.3% from 3.2%. The number of claimants grew from 21,915 to 22,390.




Figure 11: Monthly Claimant Count, Unique Job Postings and Total Number of Eligible Staff Furloughed January 2020 Onwards Source: ONS Claimant Count, Lightcast Unique Job Postings and HMRC Job Retention Scheme

5. Job Postings

Unique job posting data is drawn from a range of sources and provides timely data on how the trend in the number of live job adverts is changing in the Leicester and Leicestershire area by occupation.

However, the number of job adverts being posted is not a direct measure of labour force demand. Job adverts may not be removed from online job vacancy boards immediately once a position is filled, so the data may not fully reflect companies who have halted active recruitment.

The data is compiled from multiple job vacancy boards and adverts may still be considered "live" if the posting is still on any board, even when it has already been removed from an alternative source (Lightcast remove job postings from their Analyst platform after 61 days).

The scope of online job adverts does not fully capture the region's economic activity because of differing advertising methods, for example, casual work may be advertised by word-of-mouth.

Table 1 demonstrates unique job postings by occupation for June 2023. These are compared with March 2020, June 2022 and May 2023. Standard Occupation Codes are at a two-digit level.

The number of unique job postings for June 2023 is higher than June 2022 by 11,595 (29,247 compared to 40,842). This is a rise of 39.6%.

Over the last month the number of job postings grew from 38,855 to 40,842. This is a rise of 1,987 or 5.1%.

In terms of numbers, over the last year there has been growth in job postings in all occupation areas except protective service occupations.

In the last month there has been growth in job postings in all but four occupation areas.

As a means of further understanding how the local jobs market is changing, Table 2 demonstrates the year-to-date unique job postings figures for 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023 and compares these.

Across the job market the number of unique job postings (YTD) has increased from 42,931 in 2019 to 97,601 in 2023. This is growth of 54,670 or 127.3%. All occupations areas have seen growth.




Figure 13: Leicester and Leicestershire Unique Job Postings March 2020 to June 2023 Source: Lightcast

6. Business Closures and Incorporations

In June 2023 the number of businesses that ceased trading was 1,016. The figure for June 2019 was 482, 2020 41, 2021 884 and 2022 901.

In May 2023 there were 918 businesses that ceased trading. This is a monthly rise of 98 failures.




Figure 14: LLEP Area Dissolved or Liquidated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame

Figure 14 below compares the monthly numbers of dissolved or liquidated businesses for the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.




Figure 15 demonstrates the cumulative growth in business failures for the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.




Figure 16: LLEP Area Cumulative Growth in Incorporated Businesses 2019, 20, 21, 22 and 23. Source: BVD Fame

In 2023 (to the end of June) there were 5,895 incorporations. For the same period in 2019 the figure was 5,663, in 2020 5,918, 2021 5,129 and 2022 5,588.

In June 2023 the number of businesses that were incorporated was 899. The figure for June 2019 was 868, 2020 1,332, 2021 751 and 2022 863.




Figure 17: LLEP Area Incorporated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame




Figure 18: LLEP Area Dissolved and Incorporated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame




Figure 19: LLEP Area Dissolved and Incorporated Businesses Monthly Area Comparator Source: BVD Fame

When comparing closures with incorporations in 2023 (YTD) there were 5,755 closures and 5,895 incorporations. This is a difference of 140.

Table 4 demonstrates those sectors where there have been 15 or more business failures and 15 or more incorporations for the year to date (2023). Table 4 also helps provide an understanding of the impact of the cost-of-living crisis on business and how different sectors are reacting to it. It shows how different parts of the local business community are expanding and contracting.
