# 1. Economic Roundup

A summary of some key announcements since the last update together with a round-up of recently published research and insights from a range of organisations.

## Announcement/ News Story/ Press Release

## 2. Claimant Count

In July 2023 the claimant rate in the Leicester and Leicestershire area was 3.4%. This translates to 22,945 claimants. In June the figure was 3.2% (22,195). At a national level the claimant rate in England was 3.8%. This is 0.4 of a percentage point higher than the local figure.

The picture is very different in the city and county with Leicester having a claimant rate of 5.3% and Leicestershire 2.3%. This is a difference of 3 percentage points. Leicester's claimant rate is 1.5 percentage points higher than the England average (3.8%) and Leicestershire's 1.5 percentage points lower.




Figure 1: LLEP Area Claimant Rate (%) July 2022 – July 2023




Figure 2: LLEP Area Claimant Rate (%) July 2020 - July 2023

Figure 2 below provides an annual comparator for the Leicester and Leicestershire area and compares this with regional and national figures.

Of the 22,945 claimants over half (56.7% or 13,020) were based in Leicester and 9,925 or 43.3% in Leicestershire.

In March 2020 the claimant rate was 2.3% (or 15,145). Between March 2020 and the end of July 2023 the claimant rate increased by over a percentage point to 3.4% (22,945). This translates to an additional 7,800 claimants or a percentage increase of 51.5%.




Figure 3: LLEP Area Claimant Count July 2022 – July 2023 Source: ONS

In the Leicester and Leicestershire area over the period March to August 2020 the number of claimants grew from 15,145 to 36,025 (it's peak locally). This was a rise of 20,880 claimants or 138%. When comparing the figures for August 2020 and July 2023 against those for March 2020 the difference has fallen from 20,880 to 7,800. Since July 2022 the number of claimants has risen by 2,240 (from 20,705).

Figure 11 later in the report, demonstrates the claimant rate over the period January 2020 to July 2023 and the number of unique job postings (for the same period).




Figure 4: LLEP Area Claimant Forecast Average to July 2024 Source Data: ONS




Figure 5: LLEP Area Claimant Rate Forecast, 3, 5, 8 and Forecast Average, July 2024 Source Data: ONS

Figures 4 and 5 below project claimant numbers forward to the end of July 2024. Projections are based on the last 3, 5 and 8 months and an average of these. This helps to identify the direction of travel in relation to claimant numbers. The average figure for July 2024 is 26,684 or 3.9%. This is above the pre-pandemic level of 2.3%. Figures continue to demonstrate an upward trend in claimant numbers.

Note: Forecasts are linear, claimant numbers however are governed by a variety of events both foreseen and unforeseen, as such forecast data should be treated with caution.

In relation to age figures for July 2023, these demonstrate that there were on average a larger share of 25-49 (3.9%) and 18-24 years olds (3.9%) than claimants that were 50 and over (2.6%). The national claimant rate for 18–24-year-olds (4.9%), 25–49-year-olds (4.4%) and those are 50+ (2.8%) are higher nationally than for the Leicester and Leicestershire area.




Figure 6: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Age (%) July 2022 – July 2023 Source: ONS




Figure 7: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Claimants Aged 18-24 (%) July 2022 – July 2023 Source: ONS

Figure 7 below demonstrates the claimant rate for 18-24 years olds for the Leicester and Leicestershire area and its component parts.

Twelve thousand six hundred and thirty (55%) claimants were male and 10,315 (45%) were female.




Figure 8: LLEP Area Claimant Rate by Gender (%) July 2022 – July 2023 Source: ONS




Figure 9: LLEP Area Claimant Count July 2015 – July 2023

# 3. Universal Credit Claimants

Universal Credit claimants are placed in a conditionality group based on their circumstances and work capability. This determines what is expected of them during their claim.

Over the last month (June to July) the numbers searching, planning, or preparing for work has risen from 28,080 to 29,007. The numbers who are working has fallen from 33,418 to 33,388.

From July 2022 those searching, planning, or preparing for work has risen by 3,435 (from 25,572). Over the same period those with no work requirements grew by 7,221 (23,664 to 30,885).

Since March 2020 there has been a significant rise in the number of people who are not seeking work/ have no work requirements with numbers almost trebling during the period. In March 2020, the figure was 10,997 and in July 2023 it was 30,885 (a rise of 19,888 or 181%).




Figure 10: LLEP Area Universal Credit Claimant Count by Conditionality Group March 2020 – July 2023

# 4. Relationships

The figure below demonstrates the relationship between the claimant count and unique job postings. Data is for the period January 2020 onwards in the Leicester and Leicestershire area.

In July there was a fall in the number of unique job postings (36,061 to 33,483). The claimant rate over the same period in the Leicester and Leicestershire area has increased to 3.4% from 3.2%. The number of claimants grew from 22,195 to 22,945.




Figure 11: Monthly Claimant Count, Unique Job Postings and Total Number of Eligible Staff Furloughed January 2020 Onwards Source: ONS Claimant Count, Lightcast Unique Job Postings and HMRC Job Retention Scheme

# 5. Job Postings

Unique job posting data is drawn from a range of sources and provides timely data on how the trend in the number of live job adverts is changing in the Leicester and Leicestershire area by occupation.

However, the number of job adverts being posted is not a direct measure of labour force demand. Job adverts may not be removed from online job vacancy boards immediately once a position is filled, so the data may not fully reflect companies who have halted active recruitment.

The data is compiled from multiple job vacancy boards and adverts may still be considered "live" if the posting is still on any board, even when it has already been removed from an alternative source (Lightcast remove job postings from their Analyst platform after 61 days).

The scope of online job adverts does not fully capture the region's economic activity because of differing advertising methods, for example, casual work may be advertised by word-of-mouth.

Table 1 demonstrates unique job postings by occupation for July 2023. These are compared with March 2020, July 2022 and June 2023. Standard Occupation Codes are at a two-digit level.

The number of unique job postings for July 2023 is higher than July 2022 by 2,977 (30,506 compared to 33,483). This is a rise of 9.8%.

Over the last month the number of job postings fell from 36,061 to 33,483. This is a fall of 2,578 or 7.1%.

In terms of numbers, over the last year there has been positive growth in job postings in all but six occupation areas.

In the last month there has been negative growth in job postings in all but two occupation areas, protective service occupations and skilled agricultural and related trades.

As a means of further understanding how the local jobs market is changing, Table 2 demonstrates the year-to-date unique job postings figures for 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023 and compares these.

Across the job market the number of unique job postings (YTD) has increased from 48,665 in 2019 to 99,908 in 2023. This is growth of 51,253 or 105.3%. All occupations areas have seen growth except transport and mobile machine drivers and operatives.




Figure 13: Leicester and Leicestershire Unique Job Postings March 2020 to July 2023 Source: Lightcast

# 6. Business Closures and Incorporations

In July 2023 the number of businesses that ceased trading was 818. The figure for July 2019 was 698, 2020 66, 2021 688 and 2022 965.

In June 2023 there were 1,020 businesses that ceased trading. This is a monthly fall of 202 failures.




Figure 14: LLEP Area Dissolved or Liquidated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame

Figure 14 below compares the monthly numbers of dissolved or liquidated businesses for the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.

In 2023 (to the end of July) there were 6,577 closures. For the same period in 2019 the figure was 5,533, in 2020 2,142, 2021 6,209 and 2022 7,073.




Figure 15: LLEP Area Cumulative Growth in Dissolved or Liquidated Businesses 2019, 20, 21, 22 and 23. Source: BVD Fame

Figure 15 demonstrates the cumulative growth in business failures for the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023.




Figure 16: LLEP Area Cumulative Growth in Incorporated Businesses 2019, 20, 21, 22 and 23. Source: BVD Fame

In 2023 (to the end of July) there were 6,784 incorporations. For the same period in 2019 the figure was 6,568, in 2020 7,282, 2021 5,879 and 2022 6,336.

In July 2023 the number of businesses that were incorporated was 897. The figure for July 2019 was 904, 2020 1,367, 2021 758 and 2022 765.




Figure 17: LLEP Area Incorporated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame




Figure 18: LLEP Area Dissolved and Incorporated Businesses Monthly Comparator Source: BVD Fame




Figure 19: LLEP Area Dissolved and Incorporated Businesses Monthly Area Comparator Source: BVD Fame

When comparing closures with incorporations in 2023 (YTD) there were 6,577 closures and 6,784 incorporations. This is a difference of 207.

Table 4 demonstrates those sectors where there have been 15 or more business failures and 15 or more incorporations for the year to date (2023). Table 4 also helps provide an understanding of the impact of the cost-of-living crisis on business and how different sectors are reacting to it. It shows how different parts of the local business community are expanding and contracting.
